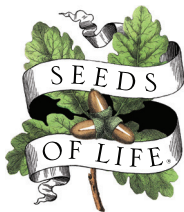
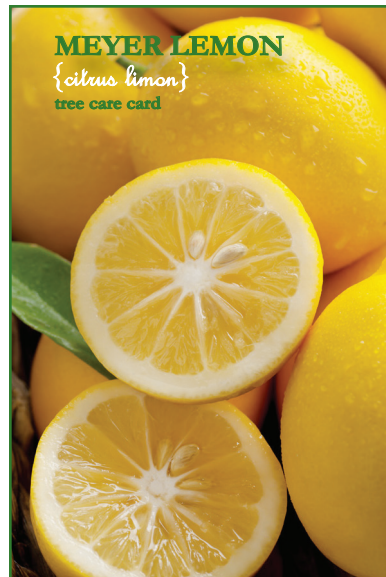

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Congratulations on the receipt of your beautiful Meyer Lemon. By following the growing and care information below you will soon have clusters of fragrant lemon blossoms and delicious plump lemons. Meyer Lemons are known for their use in culinary dishes and are easy to grow either on the patio in a container or planted in the ground in warmer environments.

PLANTING & GROWING DIRECTIONS

1. Carefully unpack your Meyer Lemon tree upon arrival. Remove burlap and plastic bag covering the container.

WATER: Thoroughly water when the soil is dry. Keep the soil evenly moist and avoid over-watering. A good rule of thumb is if the tree is in a container and in the full sun you should water your tree three times each °week until run off.



FERTILIZER: Use a citrus fertilizer found at your local garden center three times per year. Once in February, once in May and once in August. Follow the application directions on the bag.

FRUIT HARVEST: Meyer Lemons will produce some of the finest lemons to be used for many different culinary purposes. Harvest season will be heaviest from September to January when the fruit colors to a beautiful lemon color.

LANDSCAPE PLANTING: A lot of care has been taken in growing your Meyer Lemon tree. Your Meyer Lemon tree will become a specimen in your landscape. Pick a spot in the full sun or another spot with a minimum of five hours of direct sunlight. Follow in-ground planting instructions on attached planting card.

CONTAINER GROWING: These trees can be grown on the patio in full sun during the spring, summer and early fall. If your temperatures dip below 28 degrees F move your tree to an indoor area. A southern facing window that receives sunlight 50% of the day will work fine. During the winter months your tree will require less water than during the summer months.
